Where will 8.7 million people live, work, and travel in 2035? In the next 30 years, the Houston-Galveston region will add more than 3.2 million new people. Envision Houston Region is an exercise to give citizens an opportunity to determine where we will live, work, and travel. Envision Houston Region is about our future quality of life.

A citizen opportunity

With more than a million new people expected to arrive in the region every 10 years, the Houston-Galveston Area Council (HGAC) has launched an initiative designed to create a regional vision for the future growth of our area. In partnership with Blueprint Houston, *Envision Houston Region* aims to involve citizens in the process of how future growth will affect land use and transportation planning across our region.



Five regional events set for Fall

HGAC and local sponsors will host a series of workshops examining how regional growth may affect our communities. Community lead-

ers, residents, elected officials and others will participate in a "hands-on" exercise to map out alternatives for how our region may grow.
